Total Bed Utilization Rate for our CoC on the night of February 23, 2022 was **71 %**

Breakdown of Individual Utilization Rates:

- **Total Emergency Shelter Beds Utilization Rate: 61%**
 - *Total Emergency Shelter Utilization Rate W/OUT Seasonal Beds: 63%*
 - *Total Emergency Shelter Utilization Rate W/ ONLY Seasonal Beds: 55%*
- **Total Transitional Housing & Safe Haven Utilization Rate: 76%**
- **Total Permanent Supportive Housing Utilization Rate: 75%**
- **Total Other Permanent Housing Utilization Rate: 14%**
- **Total Rapid Rehousing Utilization Rate: 100%**
 - *For Rapid rehousing Projects, People = Beds. The Utilization rate will always be 100%*
