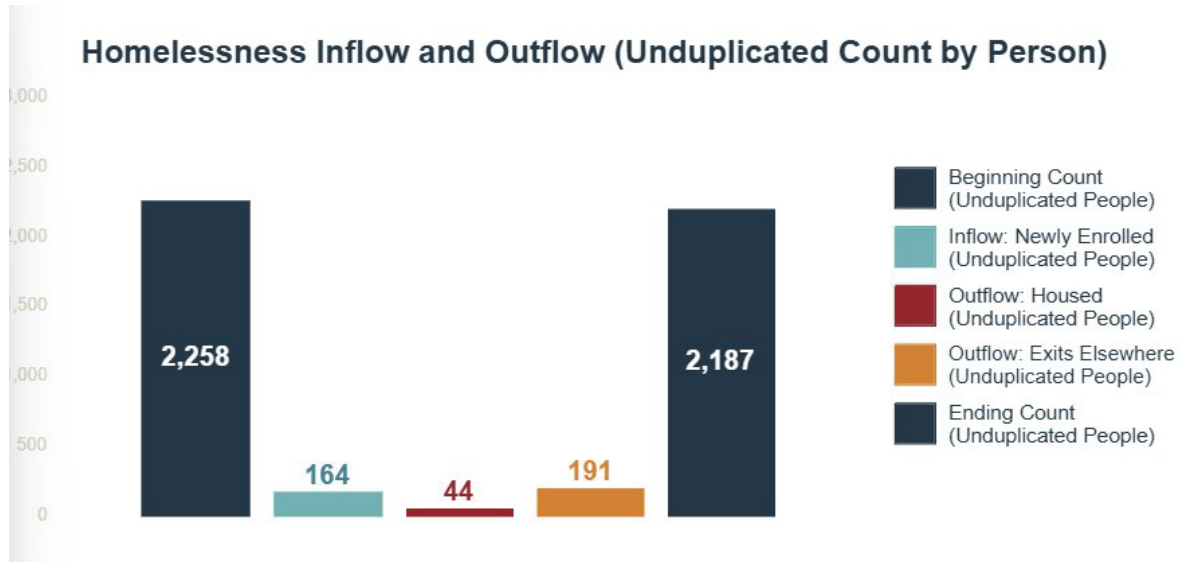
# General HMIS Data Overview: February 2025

- The number of all clients served **decreased by 18**.
- The number of all clients in a shelter or housing program **increased by 51**.
- Length of time for Rapid Rehousing **decreased 54 days to 26 days** for move-in.\*
- Length of time for Permanent Supportive Housing **increased from 777 to 806 days** for program participation.\*
- The number of clients in Emergency Shelter/Safe Haven/Transitional Housing **increased by 13**.
- **Most represented groups:**
  - Gender: **Male**
  - Race: Black, African American, or African
  - Ethnicity: Non-Hispanic/Latin(a)(o)(x); **The number of households served that identifies as Hispanic/Latin(a)(o)(x) is increasing slowly.**
- There was an **increase in the utilization of SSVF Homelessness Prevention services by 3**. The utilization of the SSVF RRH services has **increased by 2**.
- The CoC's Data Accuracy & Completeness score: **83.5%**

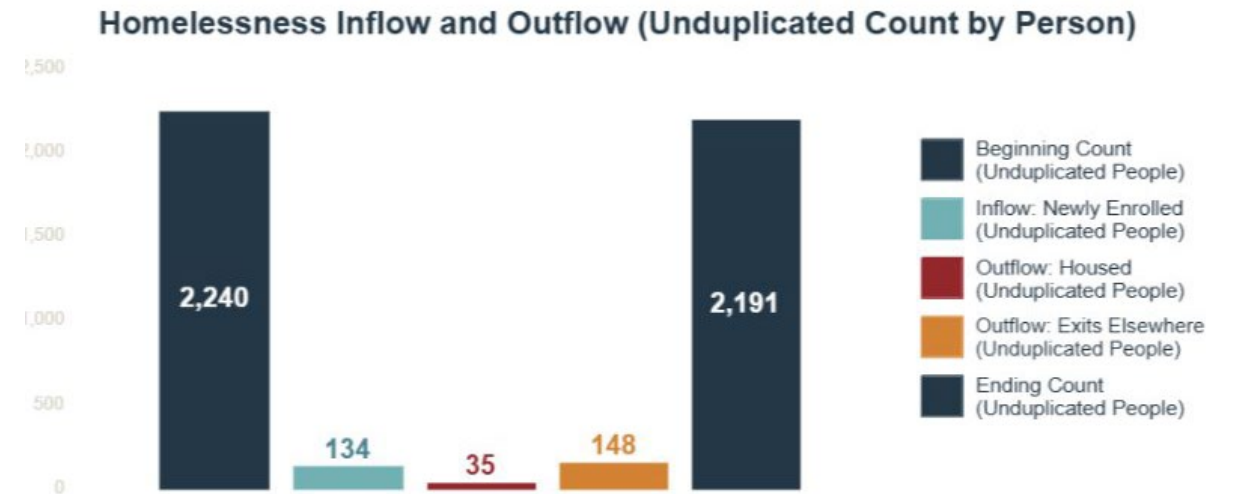

# HMIS Lead Report

- **HUD/CoC Reports submitted:** 1 – The Longitudinal Systems Analysis (LSA) was submitted timely.
- The HUD **Systems Performance Measures (SPM)** are due on 4/11/2025. We have run the initial report and submitted it to the HMIS/Data Committee for review.
- We are in the process of finalizing the data for the **Point-In-Time and Housing Inventory Counts**. We are awaiting additional guidance regarding deadline submissions and approval.

# HMIS Data Issues

- Completing the selection and any follow-up questions for universal data elements – specifically, insurance and income.
- There are also some issues with annual and interim assessments. The issues vary by agency. – *This will be discussed in greater detail during a 2025 MCAH training session.*
- Exiting clients to the correct destinations determines some of our annual metrics.
- Timely record entry (within 6 days for data completeness/within 3 days per NC-504 HMIS Policies & Procedures)

# Coordinated Entry Issues

- Completing information about gender identity (Nonbinary, Transgender). – [LGBTQIA+ 101 Training will be held on Tuesday, March 11, 2025 at 11:00AM via Microsoft Teams.](#)
- **Homelessness Timelines:** Remember the eligibility requirements for literal homelessness, specifically as is pertains to people who are in institutions (including jail) for longer than 90 days. Also remember that **sheltered** and **housed** are **not** synonymous.
- **Exit Locations:** Please ensure accuracy in exit locations for those households leaving programs (particularly shelter) so that the By-Name List can be updated appropriately.

## Policy Reminders

- 45-day activity requirement – *This includes checking in with Coordinated Entry or engaging with any CoC partner agencies that are part of the Coordinated Assessment Workgroup.*
- VI-SPDATs should only be completed by agencies that have been **approved** by the Coordinated Entry Committee and **trained** by the Coordinated Entry Lead Agency. Approval requests should be submitted to Laura Baker, Coordinated Entry Committee Chair.
